

Tom Bradley International Terminal Refurbishment Program Airline Lounge Development Program Fact Sheet

• Project Description

In a project separate from the \$723.5-million refurbishment construction of the Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT) at LAX, four new, state-of-the-art airline lounges have been built to elevate the level of amenities and comfort to international passengers. Located on the 4th and 5th floors of TBIT, the new lounges are based on the airline alliance concept, resulting in the development of one lounge each for STAR Alliance, Oneworld Alliance, SkyTeam Alliance, and the fourth for independent, non-affiliated airlines. TBIT's square footage for lounge space totals 46,972 square feet – a **72% increase in space** over the former 16 small, independent lounges. This expansion was made possible by eliminating a common corridor that provided access to each of the existing lounges and incorporating the corridor space into each of the four shared lounges.

• Traveler Benefits

Amenities incorporated into the lounges include:

- Wi-Fi access
- Individual work stations including desk kiosks, laptop hook-up and telephone
- Business center amenities such as photocopier and fax machines
- Shower facilities for travelers "in transit" on long-distance flights
- Various ethnic and local, hot and cold foods and beverages
- Local and foreign reading material, including magazines and current newspapers
- Private areas that can be partitioned from the main rooms for VIP travelers and their entourage, such as foreign dignitaries and celebrities

• Construction Dates

October 2006 – January 2008 (four phases)

• Cost

Final project cost was approximately \$20 million

• Funding
