INTRODUCTION AND ADOPTION OF OCTOBER 6, 2010 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 p.m. and roll was taken. The committee reviewed, corrected and approved the July 14, 2010 minutes.

AIRPORT COMMENTS

Pete Morejon gave an update for aircraft operations for the 3rd quarter of 2010. Year-to-date passenger count as of August 2010 is 3.2 million indicating an approximate 1% change from last year. There were 7,897 aircraft operations for July 2010 indicating a -8.1% decrease compared to the previous year, with 1 noise complaint; 7,812 aircraft operations for August 2010, a -8.2% decrease from the previous year and 3 noise complaints; 7,570 aircraft operations for September 2010, a -7.6% decrease from the previous year and 8 noise complaints. An update will be given on the 4th quarter 2010 operations and noise reports at the next meeting.

CITY OF ONTARIO

Mr. Rivera informed the committee that on September 20th the Board of Airport Commissioners authorized \$1.5 million to match the new FAA grant for soundproofing. In addition, they also authorized \$1.1 2 million as the matching grant for \$4 ½ million from the FAA. Another design phase is being initiated for sound proofing another 75 homes (phase 8) with construction starting in one week, with a targeted completion date of March 2011. Phase 8 is being funded by LAWA and FAA for \$2.2 million (construction). The City of Ontario will be working on approximately 200 homes for the next soundproofing project (phase 9), under 3 different venues. Construction for the first 90 homes is being targeted for Spring 2011, with a targeted completion date of Spring 2013 for all 200 homes. Under the Property Acquisition Relocation Program the City of Ontario has acquired 230 properties, approx. 50 acres of land since 1994 and has made the land compatible with the airport.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Morejon advised there will be another NASCAR race to be held this weekend possibly causing additional noise related calls. Mr. Morejon also reminded the committee of the new location for the Noise meetings: Annex Conference Room, 1923 E. Avion Street Room 106.
