INTRODUCTION AND ADOPTION OF OCTOBER 6, 2010 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 p.m. and roll was taken. The committee reviewed and approved the January 5, 2011 minutes.

AIRPORT COMMENTS

Pete Morejon gave an update for aircraft operations for the 1st quarter of 2011. There were 7,518 aircraft operations for January 2011, with 1 noise complaint; 6,895 aircraft operations for February 2011, with 5 noise complaints; and 8,099 aircraft operations for March 2011, with 4 noise complaints. An update will be given on the 2nd quarter 2011 operations and noise reports at the next meeting.

CITY OF ONTARIO

Mr. Rivera informed the committee that under the Residential Sound Insulation Program, approximately 1,132 dwelling units have been sound insulated; approximately 233 properties have been acquired and approximately 1,100 residents have been relocated

Mr. Rivera further informed the committee that Phase 8 original construction work has been completed. Ten additional apartment units will be completed by the end of June 2011. Phase 9 will consist of 3 different projects. Phase 9.1 has approx. 72 houses with bid opening scheduled for April 21, 2011. Phase 9.2 has approx. 58 houses with bid opening anticipated to occur in the summer of 2011. Phase 9.3 has approx. 45 houses with bid opening anticipated to occur in late 2011 or early 2012.

Under the Property Acquisition Relocation Program the City of Ontario has acquired three properties and will soon close escrow on three additional properties.

In February 2011, the City submitted two grant applications to the FAA. One grant application was for 6.0M in new Sound Insulation funding to treat approximately 200 houses. The other application was for \$4.0M to acquire 19 properties. Upon securing the new potential grants, the City will be applying to LAWA to obtain the necessary grant matching funds.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Morejon informed the committee that Great Lakes Aviation ceased operating at LA/Ontario International Airport effective May 15, 2011.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ontario citizen Elaine Franzen inquired about flight paths.

The next OANAC Meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, July 6, 2011. The meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
