

Los Angeles Airport Police Division Facility

The \$216 million, 160,000-square-foot Airport Police Facility (APF) is a purpose-built facility that consolidates Los Angeles Airport Police (APD) operations from eight different locations across the airport. Located at the corner of Loyola Boulevard and Westchester Parkway, it was designed to accommodate the operations of critical police functions with the infrastructure to support the next generation of law enforcement technologies and best practices. The facility houses the largest airport police agency in the United States, and is one of the largest police facilities in the state, providing space for more than 1,100 sworn officers, security, and staff.

Safe and secure operations are the top priorities at Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA). The consolidated facility provides for efficient communication and coordination of essential public safety services provided by the Airport Police, and includes space for the APD Office of Operations, Office of Support Services, Office of Homeland Security and Intelligence, Emergency Service Unit, Traffic and Security Group, Bomb Disposal Unit and K-9 Unit. It also features a contained practice range, multi-purpose community room, and a new 960-stall parking structure.

The facility is designed to attain, at minimum, a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver rating, built to CalGreen Tier 1 standards with a focus on state-of-the-art construction and sustainability, including dual-piping for future reclaimed water use and installation of a maximum allowance-sized solar/photo-voltaic system on the headquarters building. It also includes a new 12-foot wide landscaped paseo along the south perimeter at Westchester Parkway.
