LAX launched its first Pets Unstressing Passengers (PUP) program earlier this year in an effort to provide a less stressful airport environment for the traveling public. Volunteers and their beloved dogs undergo specialized training and certification as part of the therapy program.

With the hustle and bustle of travel, passengers will be relieved to know that an affectionate dog will be available for petting before boarding their flight every day of the week from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. Pet handlers will also be available to assist travelers with questions and provide guidance on how to navigate through the airport. LAX has 30 PUPs on rotating schedules who roam through the gate areas on the departure level of each terminal.

LAX CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS Traveler Benefits

Excitement was in the air the day visitors first viewed the New Tom Bradley International Terminal on June 22. International travelers will soon be hopping on the bandwagon of enthusiasm when they experience a fully modernized facility that can accommodate 4,500 passengers per hour, up from current 2,800 passengers.

Additional terminal improvements include...

- A "great hall" with 150,000 square feet of premier dining, retail shopping, airline lounges, a children's play area, spa, and other passenger amenities.
- Roomier boarding gate/waiting areas with half of the seats integrated with electrical outlets for charging personal electronic devices.
- Triple (for A380s) and dual passengerloading bridges for faster boarding and deplaning.
- 18 new aircraft boarding gates, of which half can accommodate larger, new-generation (Group VI) aircraft.
- Public art commissions and Integrated Environmental Media System consisting of seven iconic state-of-the-art features.

Fun Facts About Modernizing LAX

New construction at LAX is pumping billions of dollars and tens of thousands of jobs into the Los Angeles economy-making an essential contribution to our future and ensuring that LAX will continue to be L.A.'s economic engine for years to come.

To help put this incredible project in

perspective, here are some amazing "fun facts" about the New Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT). Upon completion, the New TBIT will...

- Provide 1,179,000 of useable square feet, nearly 40% greater than that of the U.S. Capitol Building in Washington, D.C.
- Contain 45,000 tons of steel, enough to build 148 Airbus A380 super jumbo jets, or 22,206 mid-sized SUVs.
- Contain 310,785 square feet of glass, enough to create a window the size of 6.5 football fields.
- Contain 405,405 cubic feet of concrete, enough to fill 8,000 cement trucks, or to create a 1-foot-thick slab of concrete the size of 8.5 football fields.

Q: Who's paying for the construction at LAX?

A: Modernizing LAX is paid for entirely by airport operating revenues, CIP (Capital Improvement Program) funds, fees from passenger facilities charges (PFC) and airport revenue bonds—no monies from the City's General Fund are being used.

This is the largest public works project in City history with over \$4.11 billion in completed or on-going projects, and billions more planned in the future to complete the LAX Master Plan. The total investment includes approximately \$1 billion in direct and/or indirect improvements to passenger safety and security.
