

## **ANNOUNCEMENT FROM TSA AND LAWA AIRPORT POLICE**

### **RE: Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT) New Employee Access Lane**

The Los Angeles World Airports, Airport Police Division, in partnership with the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), is implementing an innovative and technology-based pilot program involving Sterile Area badge holders employed by concessionaires and terminal vendors.

Effective May 1, 2018, Sterile Area badge holders will begin the process of exchanging their active tan-colored Sterile Area badges with pink-colored Sterile Area badges. On May 16, 2018, all tan Sterile Area badges will be deactivated and only pink Sterile Area badges will be valid.

In addition, effective May 16, 2018, all Sterile Area badge holders seeking access to the Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT), will be required to use a newly created Employee Access Lane located in the connector between TBIT and Terminal 4. Before entering the Sterile Area, employees will be required to scan their Sterile Area badge at a new access control card reader and to submit to TSA Screening.


# LAX New Terminal ID Color May 1, 2018




To ensure TSA regulatory compliance, the Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) has developed an accelerated, phased-out approach for replacement of current tan-colored Terminal ID cards to pink-colored Terminal ID cards.

Effective May 1, 2018 to May 15, 2018, applicants requesting a new, renewing an active, or replacing a lost, stolen, or damaged LAX Terminal ID, will be issued the new pink-colored card. Starting May 16, 2018, retired tan-colored Terminal IDs will no longer be valid and will be confiscated.
