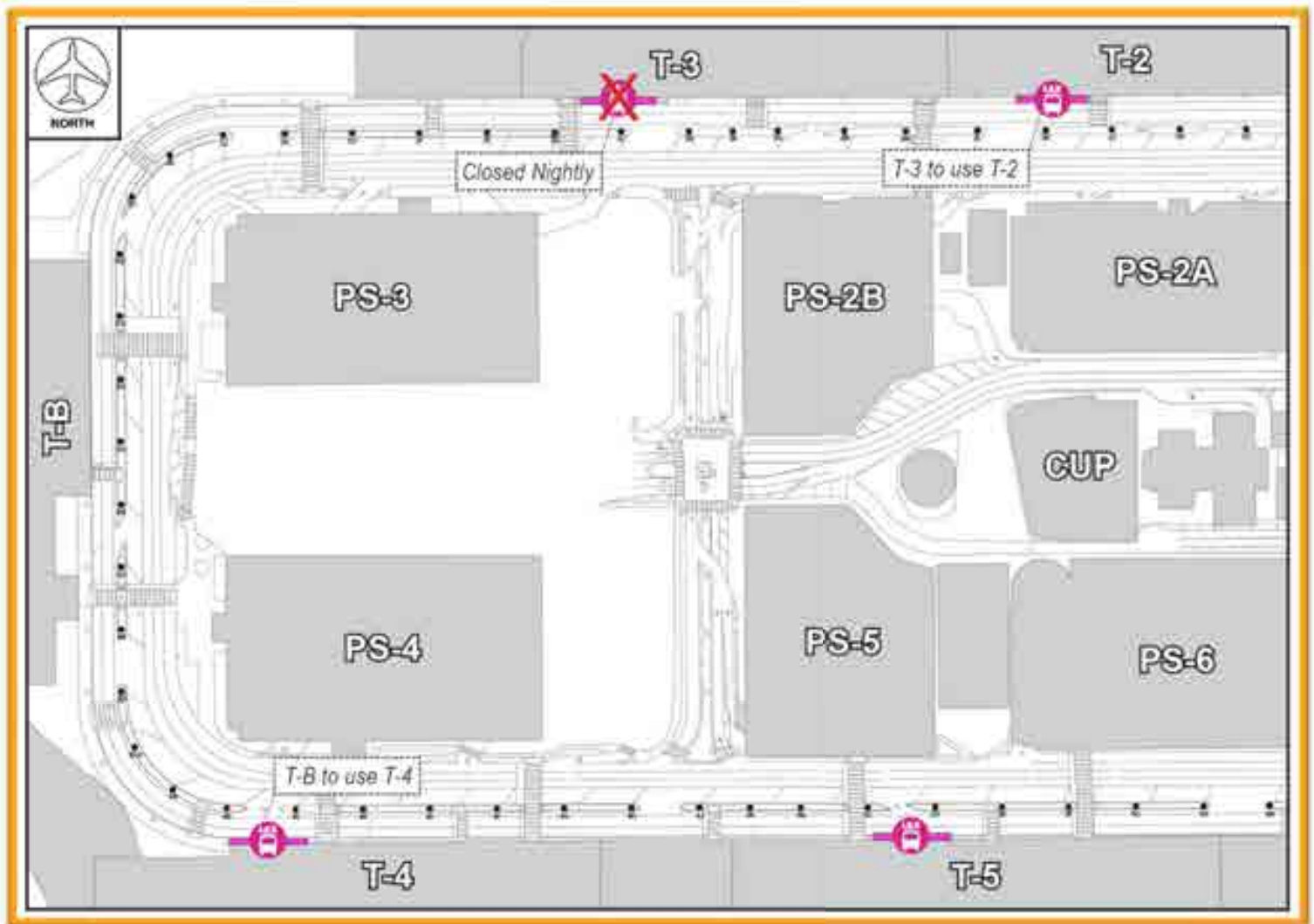


Construction Hot Topics

Week of February 21, 2023

1. Terminal 3: LAX Shuttle Stop Closed Nightly

- To facilitate the installation of underground utilities for the Landside Access Modernization Program, Arrivals Level Inner Lanes at Terminal 3 will be restricted through Friday, March 31, nightly from 1AM to 8AM
- During work, the LAX Shuttle Stop (pink) at Terminal 3 will be closed
- Pedestrians at Terminal 3 will be directed to the stop at Terminal 2 and pedestrians at Terminal B will be directed to the stop at Terminal 4
- Vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be maintained at all times; please watch for posted detour signage and use caution when traveling near construction areas



When the Terminal 3 LAX Shuttle Stop is closed overnight, guests will be directed to the next available stop

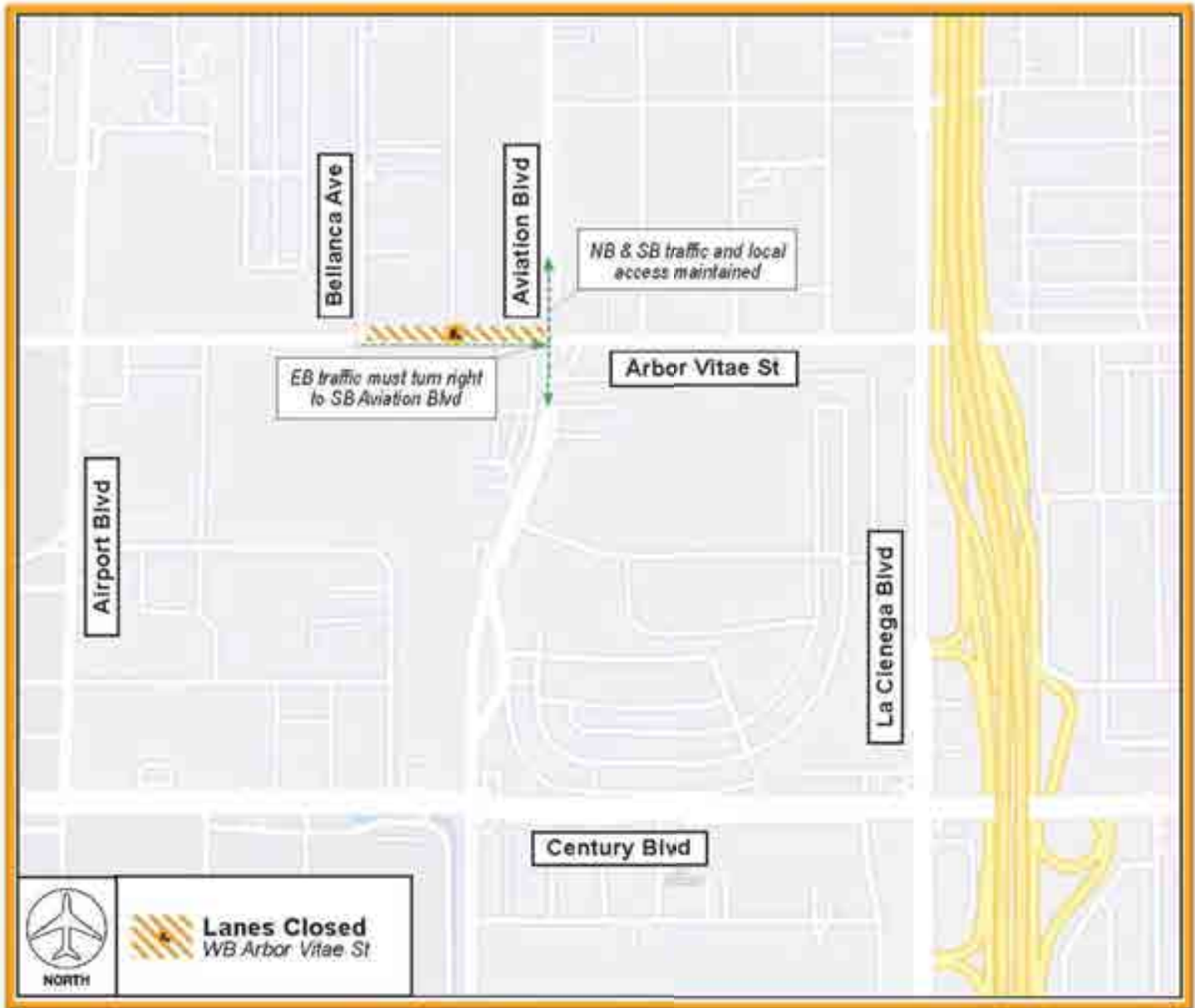

2. Terminal 3: LAX Shuttle Stop Closed Nightly

- To facilitate utility investigations for the LAX Consolidated Rent-A-Car facility project, westbound Arbor Vitae Street between Aviation Boulevard and Bellanca Avenue will be closed through March 10 (Monday to Friday nightly: 8pm to 6am; Saturday daily: 8am to 6pm)
- Eastbound traffic on Arbor Vitae Street will be merged into a single right-turn lane; southbound traffic on Aviation Boulevard will merge into a single lane; northbound and southbound traffic and access to local business will be maintained on Aviation Boulevard



Lane closures will be in place on westbound Arbor Vitae Street for utility investigations

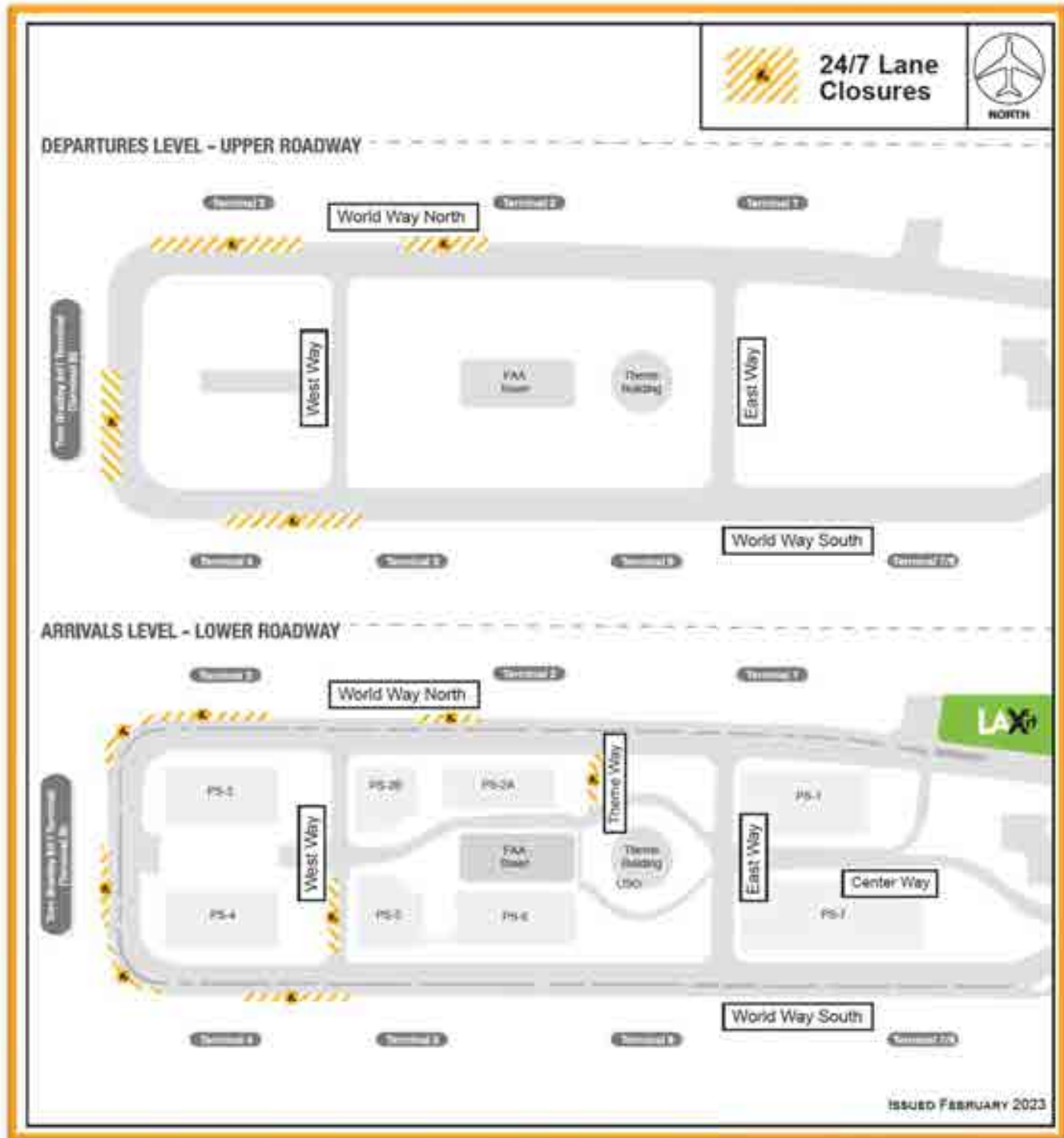
