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COMMUNITY NEWS LAX Runway Construction Presentation & Airfield Tour for Rotary Club Meeting



LAX kicked off the month of March by hosting a meeting, presentation, and airfield tour for the Rotary Club of Inglewood on St. Patrick's Day. Meeting highlights included an LAX Runway Construction presentation and the popular airfield tour.

The airport's runway construction project is an outcome of the federal government requiring U.S. airports to improve the Runway Safety Area (RSA), a safety zone at the ends of each runway. RSA improvements will result in the phased closure of each of LAX's four runways during an anticipated three-year construction period.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS Self-Identification Autism Program

For travel purposes, families with autistic children can now participate in an autism self-identification program as of April 1 at LAX. The program helps identify behavior and defuse potential incidents with airport staff, airline personnel, and police facilitating the travel experience.

Families voluntarily self-identify at the ticketing counter of participating air carriers and receive two stickers per child (one for the front and the other for the back). Participating carriers include American, United, Copa, Air New Zealand, Southwest, and Virgin America. Employees have undergone training to recognize the stickers and their meaning. Tips for Travelers with Disabilities

For travelers with disabilities, the following list of helpful tips was drafted for your convenience before your next trip through LAX. Try to read about your airline's seating, baggage and service policies. Advise your airline or ask about the following:

- Any equipment needed for mobility such as a wheelchair or scooter; medical oxygen or portable dialysis equipment
- Wheelchair service is provided free of charge and no tipping is required
- If you require therapeutic oxygen, ask about policy and cost
- If traveling with a comfort animal or psychiatric service animal, ask about documentation requirements and restrictions

LAX CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS April Construction Projects

Major construction projects at LAX will continue to impact travelers during April with sidewalk and vehicle lane closures and in-terminal work. This construction, part of a multi-billion dollar capital improvement program, underway throughout LAX will result in a modern airport that significantly improves the overall customer experience.

LAX Northside Plan Update

The LAX Northside Plan Update (NPU) includes the proposed LAX Northside Design Guidelines and Standards that reflect new land uses, community input, current best-practices in design and sustainability, and clear zoning restrictions and development standards. The LAX NPU seeks to create a realistic framework for future development that reflects the needs of both the airport and community.

The land was originally acquired by LAX more than 30 years ago to create a buffer between the airport and adjacent communities. Planning for the reuse of the LAX

Northside began in the 1980s, and in 1984 more than 4.5 million square feet was approved for commercial development. Development is currently governed by the LAX Plan and Specific Plan, which incorporates the 1980s development design.

Today, the proposed LAX NPU, if approved, would include substantial open space, recreational uses, community and civic uses, as well as current design standards, sustainability commitments, pedestrian-friendly amenities, and transit integration. The Board of Airport Commissioners approved the NPU's final EIR (Environmental Impact Report) in March. Next, the LA Department of City Planning is scheduling a public hearing for the project.

LAX Named 2014 Best Airport -North America

LAX was named the "2014 Best Airport-North America" by *Business Traveler*, a leading print and online international magazine announced January 12, 2015. The award recognizes the airport's "investment of billions of dollars and commitment to creating a transportation hub focused on connections, comfort, quality and value that improve the travel experiences of road warriors."

Q: What happened to the Proud Bird's lease?



A: On January 15, 2015, the Board of Airport Com-

missioners approved a 20-year lease with Runway Two-Five Corporation (RTFC) for restaurant, banquet and meeting facilities at 11022 Aviation Boulevard. RTFC currently leases the property operating as The Proud Bird Restaurant.

RTFC expects to invest at least \$5 million into renovating the property by bringing the buildings up to current code; replacing the roof; upgrading the property, including gift shop; and integrating displays focusing on the Tuskegee Airmen of World War II, as well as other historical aviation displays.
