BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES FORUM

Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti and LAWA officials addressed nearly 1,000 local business owners at the LAMP Business **Opportunities Forum** held on Dec. 14, encouraging them to get involved in the estimated \$1.8-billion second wave of contracts for construction of the LAX Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP).

"The forum was designed for the local and small business community to engage and have networking opportunities with firms proposing on three new LAMP projects," said LAWA Chief Executive Officer Deborah Flint. "It's essential that a program of this size and duration must create new jobs and opportunities, and the participation of LA's small, local and diverse businesses will be one of the key indicators of success for Los Angeles World Airports."

The overall LAMP will deliver a world-class transportation system for LAX that is designed to relieve traffic congestion within the Central Terminal Area and on surrounding streets, improve access options and the overall airport guest experience for travelers, and connect via a station to Metro's light-rail system. The 2016 LAX Collection Drive for the Bob Hope Hollywood USO was a resounding success. Day of Discovery Popularity Rises

The 2nd Annual Day of Discovery, a community aviation and aerospace event was held in early November at Loyola Marymount University (LMU). This free community event hosted by Loyola Marymount University and LAX Community Relations drew over 400 local residents and students to campus to learn and be inspired by the aerospace and aviation industries. The event featured more than 20 expo exhibitors and an amazing keynote address by Astronaut Dr. Anna Fisher, a 38vear veteran with NASA and the first mother to fly in space.

There were new interactive activities at this year's event including a STEM challenge for local middle school and high school students sponsored by Boeing in partnership with LMU's Seaver School of Science and Engineering, and breakout education sessions on the history of the Goodyear Blimp and on LAX's Landside Access Modernization Program. Event attendance was 33 percent higher than in 2015.

Westchester Celebrates 75 Years

safety issues in the community. City Council declared Dec. 6, Westchester Day, in honor of its rich history in the region's aviation and aerospace industry. The resolution notes William M. Mines leased a small portion of ranchland just south of the Westchester area to build an aircraft landing strip in the early 1920s, would eventually become Los Angeles International Airport (LAX); and the region became the major center of aviation-related industry.

LAX CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Airport Commissioners Approve Plans for Terminal 1.5

Los Angeles Airport Commissioners approved environmental and aesthetic plans related to the proposed Terminal 1.5 Project, which would enhance the guest experience at LAX by providing additional space for ticketing, security screening, and baggage claim, along with connecting Terminals 1 and 2.

The proposed project, which requires final approval from the Los Angeles City Council, includes a 417,515-square-foot, six-level building that will span the 400-foot-long space between Terminals 1 and 2. It would also require demolishing a boarding gate in Terminal 1.

If approved by the City Council, the Terminal 1.5 is expected to be completed in 26 months, opening Summer 2019. More information about the proposed project, is available at www.ourlax.org.
