President's Note Ken Roberts



As usual, Los Angeles Leads the Way

ext September, in 2021, it will have been 20 years since the 9/11 terrorist strikes. Can it be so? We were frightened then, in the summer of 2001, looking over our shoulders. Do you remember?

A mild recession quickly became a much larger one. Trade slumped. Los Angeles was replaced as the nation's top Customs district, ironically, by New York City. It was a lesson in the role trade plays in our economy. Buying from consumers and businesses alike fell sharply, hammering imports from Asia into Los Angeles.

Through the end of the year, U.S. trade fell rapidly. But then, in 2002, it fell less than 1 percent. And Los Angeles was once again on top.

In 2003, U.S. trade grew and in 2004 set a new record, the first of five straight record years. In 2004, 2005 and 2006, trade grew more than 10 percent annually. By 2008, trade had grown by 83 percent from its trough, nearly doubling.

Of course, coming out of the terrorist strikes, the world was not the same.

We adjusted to taking our belts and shoes off at the airport, taking laptops out, emptying pockets and enduring other inconveniences. It wasn't just inconveniences, though, was it? We struggled with the loss of privacy, a great and defining liberty. We acquiesced to government surveillance unimaginable a year or two earlier.

Fast forward to the spring of 2020. Although trade fell slightly in 2019, in Los Angeles and around the country, largely the result of the U.S.-China trade war, trade is likely to fall much more in 2020. We shut down the U.S. economy in the spring in an attempt to fight the coronavirus pandemic.

At this writing, the U.S. economy had shed 30 million jobs in five weeks, dropping job gains dating back nine years. It's been as stunning as it has been rapid. We are worried, looking over our shoulders. We don't think 20 years out, can't. We worry about tomorrow.

This might be worse than the 2001 terrorist strikes. It's well above my pay

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grade to even speculate. But I believe, and hope you believe, in the resilience of Los Angeles, of California, of the United States, of the powerful and postive efffects of globalization.

When will the United States again set a record for U.S. trade? I don't want to venture a guess. In 2019, even though U.S. trade fell slightly, it was the second consecutive year trade topped \$4 trillion.

My guess is the decline will be steep, hit by a trifecta of massive challenges: coronavirus, the U.S.-China trade war and the collapse of global oil markets.

All three are having their day, but it won't last. Perhaps by the time you read this, my words will seem dated, a distant memory of difficult times. I hope so.

In the meantime, enjoy the 2020 version of Los Angeles TradeNumbers, a testament to the role your community plays – and will continue to play – in the welfare of the local, state, national and global economies. Los Angeles, long a leader, will continue to be one.
