CITY FLOAT WINS TOP AWARD IN ROSE PARADE

The City of Los Angeles' "Discover Los Angeles" float won the Mayor's Award for Most Outstanding City Entry-National or International at the 2016 Rose Parade, thanks to members of Team LAWA, the LAX employee volunteer program. Over 20 employees and their loved ones volunteered to decorate the float which featured the airport's Theme Building and 'LAX' lettering, Capitol Records, Hollywood Bowl, Venice Beach and a giant sun wearing trendy sunglasses.



SMALL LAX OFFICE HAS BIG IMPACT



It is about the size of a conference room, but the Hire Inglewood Program (HIP) Office in Inglewood City Hall has had a big impact on the community. A record-breaking 900 job seekers visited the Community Relations Division's satellite Job Resources office in 2015.

Inglewood Councilman Alex Padilla said, "Having access to this office in City Hall has been tremendous. We hear from our folks at events saying, Thanks to this office now I have a job and I can provide for myself and my family'."

The HIP office is a LAWA community benefits program in partnership with Inglewood since 2008.

The friendly staff at the HIP office provides local job seekers with information on job opportunities at the airport and help with online applications. "You do not have to be an Inglewood resident to use HIP office. We get visitors from as far away as Long Beach and Gardena," said Sontue Beacham, LAWA First Source Hiring Program Coordinator.

The HIP office located at One Manchester Blvd., in Inglewood City Hall, 2nd Floor, is open Monday and Wednesday. For more information, call (310) 412-4812.

AIRPORT WORKSHOP HELPS BUSINESSES

Navigating the waters of getting a contract with any city department can be complicated, but the Doing Business with Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA)" workshop makes it easier for businesses to understand the requirements for contracting with the city's three airports. The monthly workshops are coordinated by Community Relations' Business Outreach team in conjunction with the LAX Procurement Services Division.

Rose Cote, Business Outreach Coordinator, said "Our primary objective is to increase participation in LAWA's procurement process by reaching out to more small, minority, woman, and veteran-owned businesses, but everyone is welcome including multi-million dollar primes." In 2015, 138 companies attended the workshops to

learn how they could successfully bid on contracts.

The workshops provide information on the procurement process, including registration on the Los Angeles Business Assistance Virtual Network, City of Los Angeles and LAWA administrative requirements, certifications, and business assistance. All Nippon Airways (ANA) new Star Wars-themed Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner, painted in the likeness of Star Wars droid R2-D2, touched down at LAX to fly the cast of the original and new 'Star Wars: The Force Awakens' blockbuster to the movie premiere in London on Dec. 15, 2015. The stars gathered at the Flight Path Learning Center Museum to take off for the European world premiere gala. ANA began international flights with the R2-D2 plane in mid-October from its base in Tokyo.

Flight Path, one of the world's most notable aviation museums, is located in the LAX Imperial Terminal, 6661 W. Imperial Highway. It is open to the public Tuesday - Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Parking and admittance is free.

LAMP INDUSTRY FORUM



Los Angeles World Airport (LAWA) hosted an Industry Forum on February 4th, to share information on its \$5-billion dollar Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP). The event featured an overview of LAMP, discussed details of the Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain delivery method, and provided an opportunity to obtain input from industry representatives prior to release of the Requests for Qualifications (RFQs) or Requests for Proposals (RFPs).

Over 1,000 participants attended the Industry Forum held at the Sheraton Gateway Los Angeles Hotel located in Los Angeles at 6101 W. Century Blvd. Guest speakers included Mayor Eric Garcetti, Los Angeles City Councilmembers Mike Bonin and Bob Blumenfield, Board of **Airport Commissioners President Sean** Burton, and LAWA Chief Executive Director Deborah Flint.
