- Nation's second-busiest commercial airport
- Experts predict LAX could have >100 million travelers annually by 2040
- In 2018, **88** million passengers
 - In 2017, 85 million passengers
 - In 2016, 80 million passengers
- Handles between 80,000 – 120,000 cars a day in the Central Terminal Area





MODERNIZATION



\$220 million Airport Police facility to be open by mid-2021

\$14 billion modernization project to renovate and rebuild by 2023

HISTORY



- **Early History 1946-1959:** Los Angeles Airport Police traces its beginnings to 1946, when Los Angeles Airport was transferred from the U.S. War Department to the City of Los Angeles.
- **Airport Security Division 1959-1973:** The organization was known as the Security Division of the Operations Bureau. The organization was responsible for general physical security and for patrolling airport areas.
- **Airport Security Bureau 1981-1984:** In 1981, the Security Division and the Boarding Services Bureau were merged, becoming the Airport Security Bureau.
- **Los Angeles Airport Police 1984-Present:** In 1984, the Airport Security Bureau was renamed Los Angeles Airport Police.






