Construction Impacts

As the Bradley West construction continues in earnest, the TBIT building tenants are beginning to experience some significant noise impacts to the building and the premium lounges will notice visual impacts as the construction moves into the Central Core area. Demolition of the west wall of TBIT has already begun at the lower level where the north bus gates, loading dock and fire alarm control room were located. The LAWA Airport Development Group (ADG) is the program management team for Bradley West Project and has begun to look at ways to mitigate or at least lessen the noise impact to the tenants. Much of the demolition work is being done off hours, however

steel erection is scheduled for daylight hours. As the construction moves into this area, patience from the TBIT community is requested, as well as an understanding that "minor" inconveniences are going to occur at TBIT for the next few years. Focus needs to be on resolving "intolerable" conditions and working with ADG to find ways for TBIT tenants to maintain their operation while still allowing for the construction to move forward at a fast, cost effective pace. The recently completed TBIT Renovation is good example of the cooperation, patience and can do spirit from the community that resulted in a project completed on time and on budget.
