
#### **NEW DATES: TERMINAL 4 GATES**

As construction progresses on the American Airlines Terminal 4/5 Modernization Program, airline gates 49A & 49B in Terminal 4 are scheduled to re-open mid-May 2025 (closed since October 2024, previously reported to re-open mid-April 2025).

Airline Gates 40, 42B, 45, 46A and 47 are scheduled to remain closed through 2027 as work continues on this project.

Please note for all construction impacts signage will be posted alerting guests of all closures associated with this work, as well as alternate access routes.

#### **APRIL 2025: 24/7 CTA LANE RESTRICTIONS**

Here is a collective snapshot of scheduled 24/7 lane restrictions for CTA Departures and Arrivals Level Roadways for the month of April 2025.

This map only reflects 24/7 continuous lane closures in the CTA; nightly lane / sidewalk restrictions may be in place to facilitate construction activities.

Traffic around the Central Terminal Area will be maintained at all times, as well as access to passenger pick-up and drop-off and ingress to / egress from parking structures.

Motorists should plan ahead for potential delays and use caution when traveling near construction areas.
