Serve as the primary mechanism for noise-related communications with potentially affected and interested parties.




Share aviation industry topics with a public forum to cooperatively monitor and review aircraft noise-related issues affecting neighborhoods surrounding FLL

History






Membership

- Membership is primarily associated with the location of existing noise monitors and consists of 22 members.
 - 18 voting members
 - 13 representatives from affected residential neighborhoods
 - 5 aviation industry representatives (airlines, fixed-base operators)
 - 3 non-voting members
 - BCAD Noise Information Officer
 - FAA Tower Manager at FLL
 - BCAD's on-call acoustical consultant
 - 1 neutral, third-party Chairperson






Membership





Meetings and Quorum

- The ANAC holds virtual quarterly meetings.
- Meetings are open to all interested parties and include opportunity for public comment.
- Prior to the 2018 Charter update, quorum required a minimum of 4 community members and 2 aviation industry members.
- Quorum is now defined as 51% of voting members.





Accomplishments

- Recommended the implementation of airfield noise abatement signs
- Collaborated on the development of several "noise" related reports for FLL -
 - Partnership for Quieter Skies Report
 - RNAV Report
 - South Runway Nighttime Usage Report
- Provide comments on the FAA's Metroplex process for FLL
- Participated and provided input for FLL's Part 150 Update







Challenges

- Flight paths and procedures established by FAA, no opportunities for significant changes
- Reduction in participation from airline partners
- Managing community expectations
 - ANAC is an "advisory" group that makes recommendations to the Aviation Department





Next Steps

Evaluation of the ANAC pursuant to FLL's Part 150 Update recommendation to include but not limited to:

- Revised Charter
- Term limits for membership and Chairperson
- Membership will be more "jurisdictional" instead of dependent of noise monitor locations





Broward County Aviation Department Airport Noise Abatement Committee (ANAC) Charter

INTRODUCTION

The Broward County Aviation Department (BCAD) is committed to minimizing current and potential noise-related effects of operations at Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport (PLL). In 1992, the BCAD established the Airport Noise Abatement Committee (AAAC) to serve as the primary mechanism for noise-related communications with and among all potentially affected and interested parties. This Charter defines the AVAC's purpose, responsibilities, membership, and meeting structure.

PURPOS

The ANAC provides community and aviation industry interests with a public forum to cooperatively monitor and review aircraft-noise-related issues affecting neighborhoods surrounding FLL, and to recommend actions for the Broward County Director of Aviation to take to maximize the effectiveness of the Noise Compatibility Program, as implemented.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Committee has the following responsibilities:

- Provide a forum for objective discussion of noise-related issues affecting neighborhoods surrounding FLL.
- Monitor noise-related trends based on reports from the FLL monitoring system an other information sources.
- Monitor implementation of noise abatement and land use mitigation elements of the FLL Noise Compatibility Program
- Recommend appropriate steps to involve and inform the broadest possible range of community and aviation industry interests regarding FLL noise-related issues.
- Maintain communications to and from the groups that committee members represent
 Make recommendations to the Broward County Director of Aviation regarding steps
- Make recommendations to the Broward County Director of Aviation regarding ste to take to enhance the effectiveness of FLL Noise Compatibility Program and otherwise minimize noise-related impacts.
- Other actions that the members agree will support the ANAC's defined purpose.
